Formed in 1973, the HHA exists to provide practical advice and professional services to the owners of historic houses and to represent them in their effort to preserve this vital part of our heritage in the interest of the Nation. Two-thirds of Britain's built heritage remains in the hands of private owners and is preserved by them, often at considerable expense. Successive governments have endorsed the private owner as the most economic and effective guardian of the built heritage. Their paintings, furnishings and treasures can be seen in the setting for which they were designed, not as museum objects.

RICHARD COMPTON
PRESIDENT OF THE HHA

Richard Compton was elected President of the HHA in 2012 having served for five years as Deputy President. He is the owner of Newby Hall, Ripon, North Yorkshire. The HHA represents Britain's historic houses, castles and gardens in private ownership. There are 1,500 Member houses consisting of listed buildings or designated gardens, usually Grade I or II*. Many HHA houses feature in the minds of the public as symbols of Britain's unique heritage. Around 500 HHA houses and gardens are open to the public, attracting some 15 million visitors each year.

SIR LAURIE MAGNUS
CHAIRMAN OF HISTORIC ENGLAND

Sir Laurie was appointed Chairman of English Heritage on 1 September 2013 and remains Chairman of Historic England. Prior to this appointment he had been Deputy Chairman of the National Trust since 2005 and an elected member of the Trust's Council since 2003. Sir Laurie is Chairman of the Windsor Leadership Trust, and a Trustee of the Allchurches Trust and was a member of the UK Listing Authority Advisory Committee from 2001 until May 2011. Sir Laurie is a member of Historic England's Business and Finance committee, Remuneration/Appointments Committee, and is a member of the English Heritage Board of Trustees.
