The Historic Landscapes Assembly brings together those working for the protection of historic designed landscapes, to discuss key issues demanding their collective attention.

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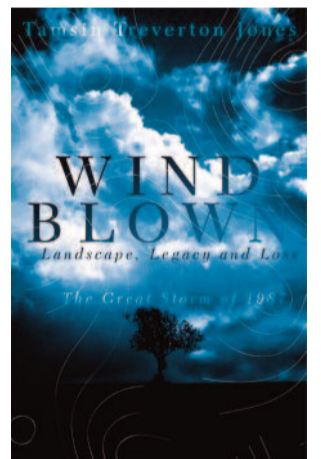
