Invitations will also be extended nationwide and should attract over 100 delegates all of whom will have a significant influence on the use and choice of materials and services in both the public and private sectors.

THE VENUE

The Liverpool Medical Institute is one of the oldest medical societies in the world. It traces its origins to the founding of the Liverpool Medical Library in 1779. The present grade II* listed building was opened in May 1837 and in 1998 underwent a major refurbishment. It is a jewel in the history of both Liverpool and medicine.

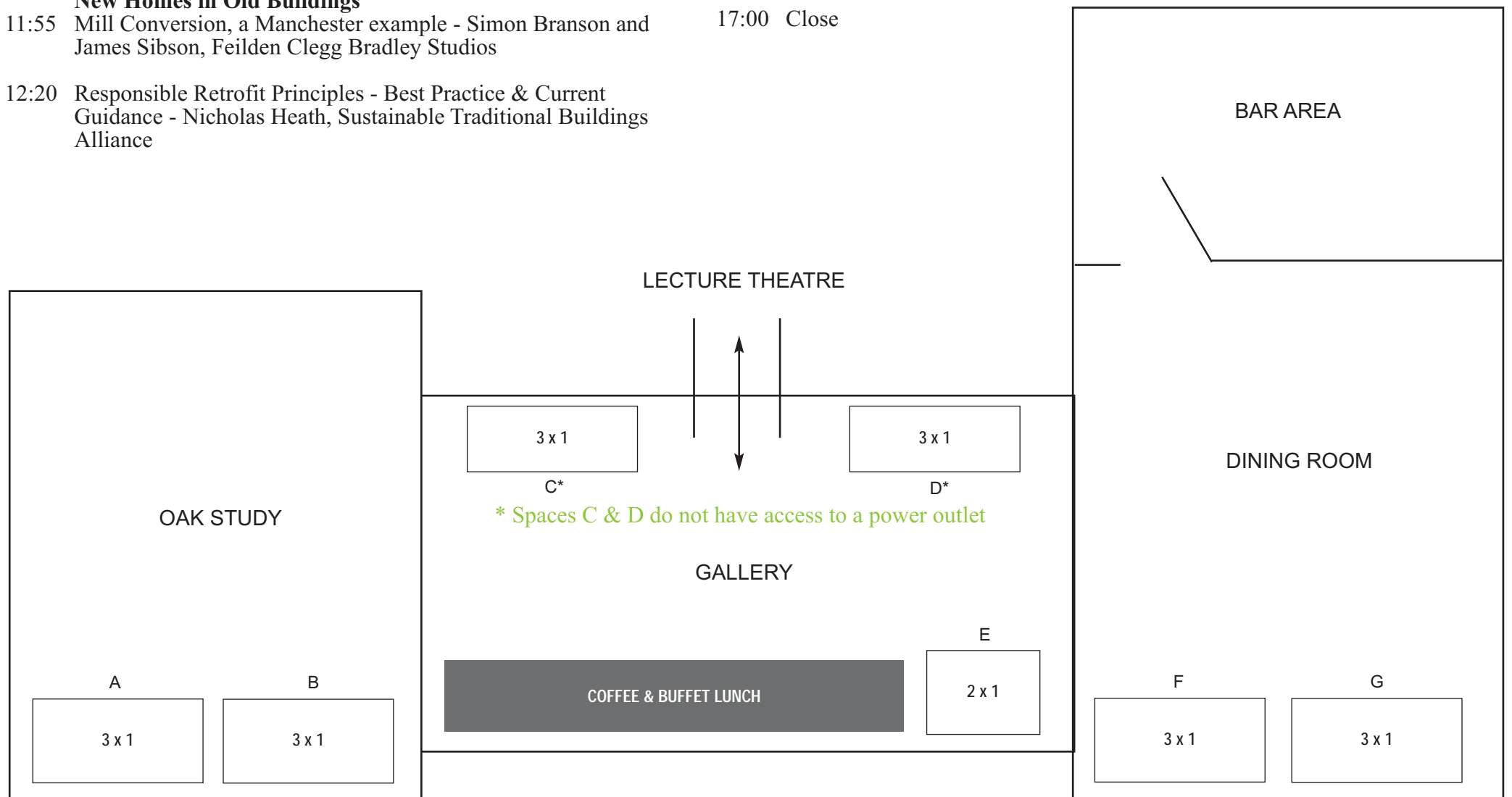
